Advocacy Meets Results: NAPA/AAIA Pass Senate

The Summer months have been filled with excellent news in the fight against Alzheimer's. As many of you know, in June, we saw two medications that treat mild cognitive decline and early Alzheimer's receive FDA approval. However, your advocacy efforts did not stop progress there. As July comes to a close, AAIA and the NAPA Reauthorization Act have passed the Senate floor unanimously!

As a refresher, NAPA was the catalyst for progress in the Alzheimer's and dementia federal programs and with so many competing demands of the federal government and its agency representatives, we are fortunate to have a law that requires a specific and coordinated focus on and resources dedicated to this disease. The original law will expire in 2025, and the NAPA Reauthorization Act would extend the law until 2035.

The Alzheimer's Accountability Act ensures Congress hears directly from the scientists at the National Institutes of Health (NIH) on how much research funding is needed to meet the first goal of preventing and effectively treating Alzheimer's by 2025. The Alzheimer's Accountability and Investment Act would extend to 2035 the requirement for NIH to submit a professional judgment budget (PJB) to Congress describing the annual funds needed to make progress against Alzheimer's disease.

The unanimous passage of both NAPA and AAIA in the Senate marks great progress in ensuring appropriate funding and planning for combating Alzheimer's disease. This progress is largely thanks to all of your advocacy efforts. Our advocacy efforts cannot stop there!

As August recess is upon us for members of Congress, many of the members will be back in the state and their districts. Please feel free to reach out to your legislator's local district office, as we still want our Georgia delegation to push for House action on the AAIA and NAPA.

Though the push for further action is vital for these bills' final passage, we also encourage you to thank Senators Ossoff and Warnock for their support in passing NAPA and AAIA. Feel free to submit a thank you video through Gather Voices.

Our advocates in Georgia have done an amazing job and we hope to continue our progress. The reason we have been able to achieve as much as we have this Summer is due to each and every one of you. Your passion and ability to share
